October – February planning

February – final applications

June – signing contracts begins

- you will work to address local road safety issues.

A Land Transport Safety

Like many community groups you probably have good road safety ideas to help reduce road deaths and injuries. But you may not be sure where to go for funding to make your ideas a reality.

The Community Road Safety Programme (CRSP) is a scheme administered by the Land Transport Safety Authority (LTSA), which provides funding for local community road safety initiatives.

Your community group can apply for CRSP funding.

What can you apply for?

The CRSP provides funding for two types of community activities:

1. Community development funding

Community development is about communities identifying local road safety problems and issues, and coming up with local solutions for these.

You can apply for funding to develop and run activities or initiatives to address road safety problems identified by your community.

2. Community road safety programmes endorsed by the LTSA

Many activities that have been implemented at a community level have been so successful that they have become LTSA-endorsed programmes. These programmes have clear delivery guidelines and components. Safe with Age courses and child restraint rental schemes are two examples.

You can apply for funding to run an endorsed LTSA programme in your local community. Your LTSA regional office will tell you more about the programmes available.

The types of activities that could receive funding under the Community Road Safety Programme

- An activity that addresses a clearly identified local road safety issue.
- Relevant road safety activities that are created for and by people who identify with a particular culture (eg Maori, Pacific, Chinese, etc).
- Relevant workshops, seminars and public meetings.
- Brochures supporting your local road safety activity.
- Road safety displays.

The types of activities that are not able to be funded

- Road engineering, including signage and markings.
- Vehicles.
- Large advertising campaigns.
- Surveys and research.
